What Is TGN?

TGN is an evangelism training and outreach ministry built to equip and empower believers to go out and share the gospel. The Spirit can and will lead you — but a strong foundation makes you more confident, stronger in faith, and more consistent about sharing wherever God sends you: home, workplace, or the street.

A place for churches and evangelism groups to be trained and supported — so more of God's children are reached.

Why Evangelism?

“Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation.”

— Mark 16:15

Every believer is called — not just the naturally bold ones.

And it's not just street preaching — take it into your workplace, your friend group, your hobby circles.

The two things holding most of us back: fear of rejection and awkward conversation, and simply not knowing what to say. Being obedient doesn't mean acting only when it's comfortable — that isn't faith.

“God has not given us a spirit of fear, but one of power, love, and sound judgment.”

— 2 Timothy 1:7



THE ANALOGY

If a friend had a terminal disease, and the cure sat in your pocket — but you said nothing because you were afraid of rejection — what would that say about your love for them?

The gospel is the way to eternal life. This isn't something to play around with.

It's Not Your Job to Convert

Evangelism doesn't mean converting people. It's not your job to convince someone God is real in one conversation — people come from every background and life experience.

Your job is to plant and water seeds. God does the growing.

A conversation that feels like it went nowhere may be the seed someone looks back on in 20 years — the moment they turned back to the Lord. Be at peace: the God who saved you is big enough to save others too.

The Gospel in 4 Steps

There is one truth — not variations of it. Be prepared and rooted, so you can answer with confidence. “Always be prepared to give an answer... for the hope that you have.” — 1 Peter 3:15

1

Creation

God created everything, and it was good.

2

Rebellion

Man chose to rebel and sin entered the world — bringing death, disease, and destruction.

3

Redemption

God came down as Jesus, lived the sinless life we couldn't, and died on the cross for our sins.

4

Resurrection

He rose on the third day, defeating death — granting eternal life to all who repent and trust Him alone.

“He who believes in me has eternal life.” — John 6:47

Misconception #1: “I Save Them”

It's easy to feel like conviction and salvation depend on how well you evangelize. They don't. You are not the one saving — you are simply being used by God to plant and water seeds.

Misconception #2 will build on this — how we show people they need the cure before we hand it to them.

NOT YOUR ROLE

Converting someone. Winning the argument. Getting a decision on the spot.

YOUR ROLE

Planting and watering seeds — faithfully, genuinely, and trusting God with the outcome.

Misconception #2: Skipping the Diagnosis

Telling someone “Jesus loves you” as a quick fix, with no context, rarely lands. If someone doesn't know they need a savior, why would they call on one?

THE DOCTOR ANALOGY

“Take this medicine” with no context gets a no. But show the x-ray — “you're dying inside, and this cures it” — and nearly everyone takes it. The medicine didn't change. The reason to take it did.

We show the need using God's moral law — the Ten Commandments — before offering the cure.

“For by the works of the law no person will be declared righteous before him, for through the law comes knowledge of sin.”

— Romans 3:20

“They do not know where they are going, because the darkness has blinded them.”

— John 12:35 (paraphrase)

The goal isn't to judge — it's to open their eyes so they can see why they need Jesus.

Your Testimony

You don't need a dramatic, supernatural story. Everyone encounters God differently — and your real experience will connect with someone living a similar life. Boast in what Christ has done, not in yourself.

1

Before

How you were living life before being born again.

2

How You Met God

The moment or season you came to Him.

3

How He Changed You

Spend the most time here — give God the glory, not your past.

Above all — BE GENUINE.

Be Gentle. Lead With Love.

“Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? ... I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine who do not need to.”

— Luke 15:1-7

We evangelize because we have a heart for the lost — not to win debates or accuse. Jesus came not to be served, but to serve.

REMEMBER

- Everyone is made in God's image — show no partiality.
- Use please and thank you; lead with respect.
- You're here to make heaven as crowded as possible — not to win an argument.

Knowing When to Walk Away

Some people will not receive the gospel the way you'd like. Hearts may be hardened, or the moment just isn't right — and that's okay. You are not God; leave the results to Him.

“Do not throw your pearls before swine.”

— Matthew 7:6

If someone is being rude or picking a fight, it's okay to say thank you and walk away — then pray for their heart to soften.

“If anyone will not receive you or listen to your words, shake off the dust from your feet when you leave.”

— Matthew 10:14

Don't feel discouraged if someone ignores you completely — the Spirit will give you the words when there's room to say more.

Starting the Conversation: People You Know

In our culture, talking to strangers isn't normal anymore — this is the hardest part for most people. Start soft with people you already know, then let it segue naturally.



“Do you go to church at all?”



“Are you a spiritual person?”



“Do you ever think about what happens after you die?”

Low-pressure questions people are usually open to answering — an easy segue either way.

Starting the Conversation: Strangers

Put yourself in their shoes — they're not expecting to give their life to Jesus today. Say hello, introduce yourself, maybe give a compliment, then ask for a quick interview.

1 *"Would you consider yourself a spiritual person?"*

2 *"What do you think happens after you die?"*

3 *"If Christianity were true, would you become a Christian?"*

4 *"If I had 2 minutes to live, what would you tell me so I'd go to heaven?"*

5 *"What do you think of when you hear the name Jesus?"*

Goal: learn where their beliefs are, then let the Spirit lead you toward the gospel. Expect plenty of "no thank you" — keep it moving.

Reacting: You Don't Need Every Answer

People respond with anything — be ready. But you don't need deep theology to share the gospel; you need the basics, held with confidence.

THE NURSE ANALOGY

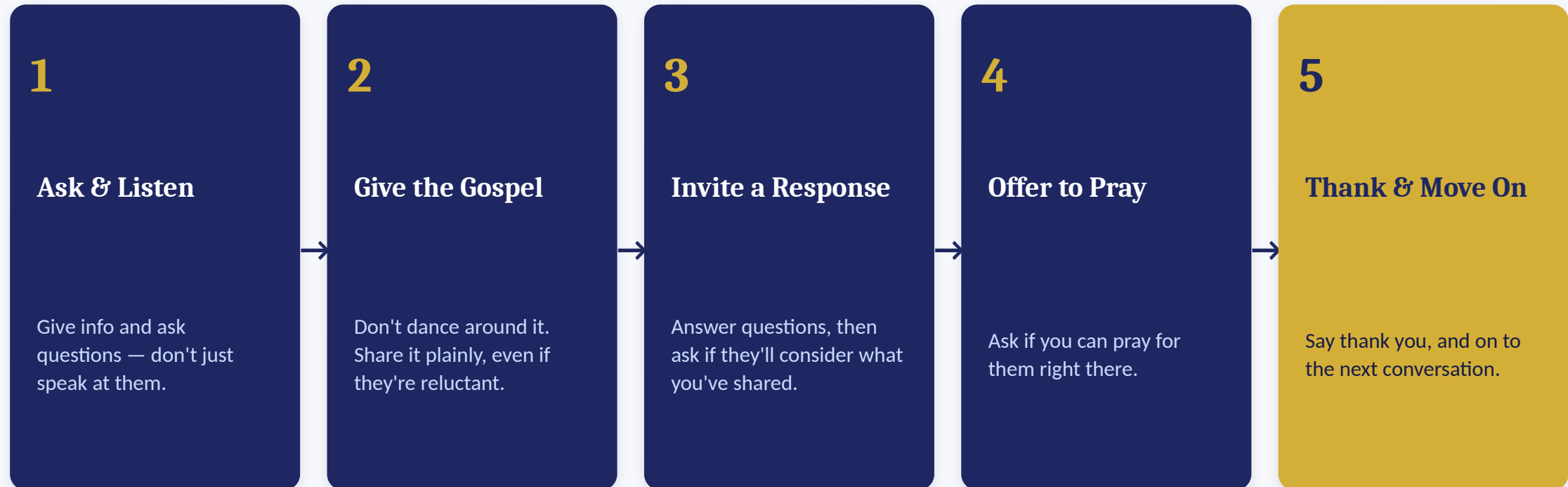
A nurse doesn't need to answer every advanced medical question — just the basics, and “I'll ask the doctor” for the rest. You don't need to master every world religion to share Jesus.

It's okay to say “I don't know” and follow up later.

“I did not come with excellence of speech or wisdom... I determined not to know anything among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified... that your faith should not be in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God.”

— 1 Corinthians 2:1-5 (paraphrase)
